

Paired Student Listening Checks

As you already know, you have been asked to doing a Listening check daily with your student who has hearing loss.

The Itinerant Teacher of the Deaf/Hard of Hearing or Educational Audiologist who you work with has determined that this student is reliable in reporting if their assistive technology is working or needs attention.

Here's a "win, win, win" opportunity for you!

You can have one less thing to do during the week.

Your student with hearing loss can gain more independence.

Your student with hearing loss and a friend can improve their friendship.

Have your student with hearing loss chose a friend to do the listening check. Alternately, this activity could be assigned as a reward to classmates for good work or behavior. You and/or the DHH specialist can show the student with hearing loss and the peer how to do a listening check. What the chosen friend presents is dependent on the student with hearing loss' auditory needs. Some students need the chosen student to present sound, others can just have the student with hearing loss repeat a word or follow a direction.

Your Itinerant Teacher of the Deaf/Hard of Hearing or Educational Audiologist will work with you to determine what is best!
