

Hearing Aid Monitoring Checklist

Hearing aids or cochlear implants can stop working at any time. Law requires that the school monitor hearing devices to ensure that they are functioning properly. It is important to check hearing devices every day. Record results on this page. The student should be expected to let the teacher know when hearing changes, such as a hearing device stops working and should be encouraged to advocate for his or her communication needs.
