

Hearing Aid Trouble Shooting Guide

You can't hear! Try these steps first.

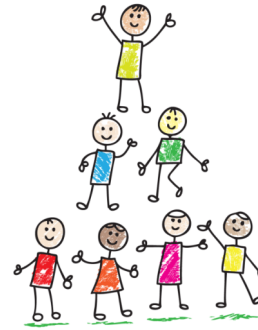


1. Look at your earmold. Is it icky? Clean it.
2. Look at the tubing. Is it torn? Contact your Itinerant. Is it icky? Clean it.
3. Is the earhook on tight? Is it cracked? Contact your Itinerant.
4. Battery- is it good? When did you last change it? Is the battery in the right way?
5. Audio Shoe: is it on tight?
6. Receiver- if you have green dots, is the lever on 2 dots? Open dot is OFF.

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Every hearing aid is a little bit different. This is a basic troubleshooting guide meant to help you try some things to get an aid working on your own!

If you still can't get your hearing aid working: CALL or EMAIL your Hearing Itinerant IMMEDIATELY! Don't sit in class not being able to hear!!
