Validation of Hearing Assistance Technology (HAT; i.e., FM): Maintain the volume level used for evaluating student responses with HA/Cl/none. To validate the benefit of HAT, it is necessary for the noise to be separated from the speech. List 9 and List 10 present classroom noise only. The evaluator must present List 9 and List 10 sentences live voice through the HAT microphone. Try to match the loudness and cadence of recorded sentences. To be comparable, List 11 and List 12 must also be presented live voice. Although these sentences are recorded, do NOT use the recorded version for HAT validation. Lists 11-15 are in quiet and provide stimuli for alternate use.
